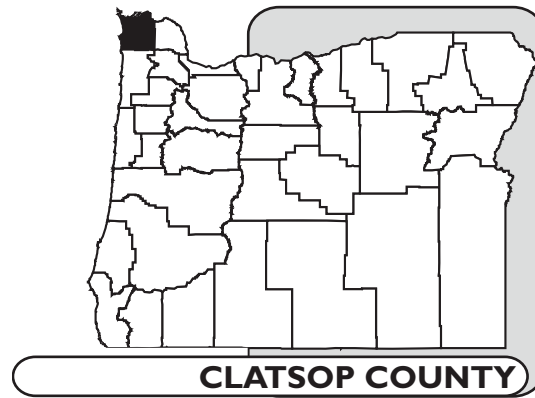

Assignment The RARE participant in Warrenton will work on four projects.

The first project involves managing a Transportation Enhancement Grant involving the Warrenton Trails Network. The participant will be responsible for: coordinating operations between local government entities, presenting information to local political bodies and working with ODOT to begin the trail development process with ODOT Grant Funds. In this project, the participant will serve as the Planning & Development Coordinator.

The second project is the implementation of Phase 1 of the Trails Master Plan. The participant will serve as Project Manager and coordinate with stakeholders to begin development of identified trail corridors and manage current trail development projects. The participant will also up-date trail maps using GIS and brochures as needed and research funding and grant possibilities.

The third project will be serving as the Trails Coordinator. In this capacity, the participant will identify and communicate with Trail Network Stakeholders, give Trails related presentations to local boards and councils, contract negotiations, develop a community outreach and education programs utilizing the local trails and parks and conduct Trails events including monthly public Trail Hikes.

The final project for the RARE participant will be developing the Adopt-a-Trail Program. The participant will coordinate volunteers working on local trail and park development and maintenance and possibly develop a city volunteer website
