

About the City of Veneta

Veneta is a city in Lane County, Oregon. Veneta was established in 1912 by Edmund Eugene Hunter, who named the settlement after his five-year-old daughter. The city has been the site of the annual Oregon Country Fair, originally called the Renaissance Faire, since 1970. The city's population is 4,560.

The Economic Development Specialist position traces its origins to the 2015 CPW project Veneta Economic Development Strategy: Five Year Action Plan, 2015-2019. The plan called for the City to create a RARE (or a "skilled intern") position using money earmarked for economic development. Corum is the third such EDS the City has hosted and it is his duty to implement the action items laid out in the plan. His five specific projects, in order of importance: Supporting Veneta's economic development efforts, developing a broadband deployment plan, developing policies that address "zombie" buildings or urban blight, completing a feasibility analysis for pop-up business in Veneta, and finally implementing the HWY 126 Beautification Plan.
