

Assignment This is one of four RARE positions sponsored by the CORE Collaborative. CORE, which stands for Connecting Oregon for Rural Entrepreneurship, is a collaboration funded by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and spearheaded by Oregon's Rural Development Initiatives. While each of the four RARE assignments will vary based on the needs of the specific communities, all CORE positions will share a focus on creating and sustaining entrepreneurship development systems in economically distressed target areas. In Union, Baker, and Wallowa Counties, the RARE participant will work closely with the Northeast Oregon Economic Development District to facilitate the formation of a local Entrepreneur Advisory Board, to conduct a needs assessment of the target area, to create an action plan, and to host appropriate trainings on entrepreneurship. While local leaders and entrepreneurs will spearhead CORE's regional efforts, a CORE Statewide Advisory Board will bring together diverse lessons learned to ultimately, impact statewide policy change.

Required Skills The RARE participant should have strong communication and organizational skills. The participant should be comfortable working as part of a team, should have strong customer service skills, but should also be able to work well independently and with little direction. The participant will need basic computer skills and the ability to think and write clearly. Finally, experience in database management, research and data analysis skills, and experience in meeting facilitation would be helpful.
