Assignment The BARR participant will assist with four key projects at the site. The first project involves secure funding for the engineering and construction phases of a new Marine Park marina. The marina will create two water easements for use and production and will raise the elevation height to allow channel booms and delivery trucks to access the park. The BARR participant will also be working to improve the beach in the Marine Park. The participant will assist funding to expand the beach for more recreation use specifically sailing. The BARR participant will also be the key contact between the Columbia Group Boating Association and the Port authority regarding demands from both stakeholders. The third project involves working with contractors to assess a comprehensive site plan for a residential development on Falls View Park. The final project involves the quarry siting for the Port's industrial park. The BARR participant will work with PBI Engineering as an environmental shape stability study. The participant will then work with the staff to locate a market for the aggregate rock.
